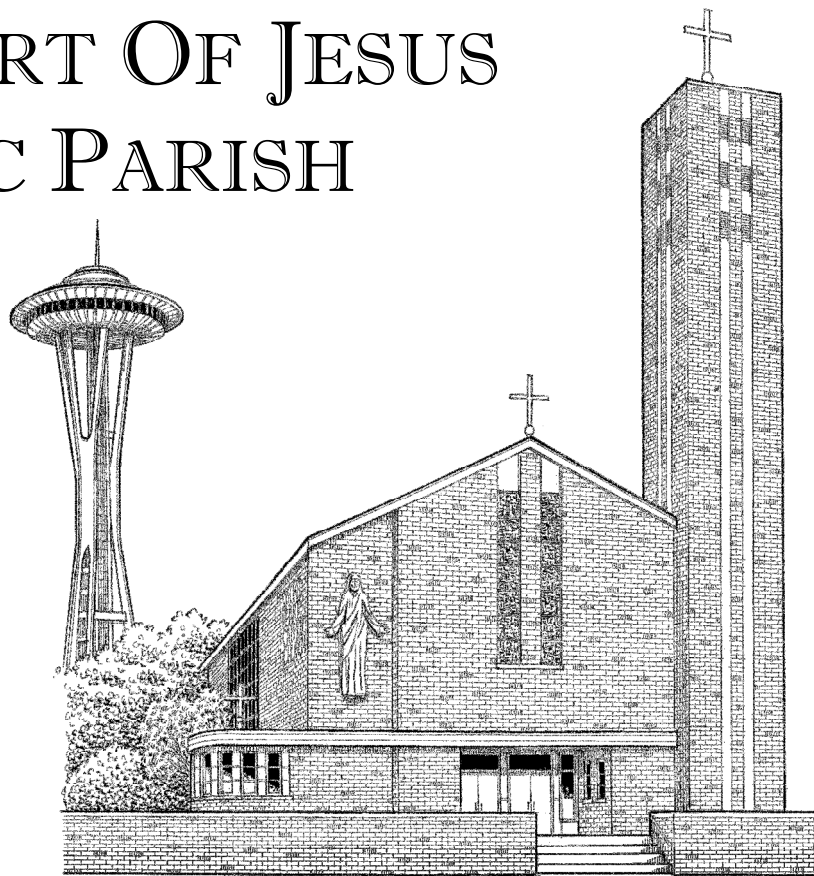

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Labor Day weekend! Labor Day is in many ways the end of summer and the beginning of a new school year. I'm not sure where the summer went. I look forward to the year ahead. Soon we will be starting our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program. If you know of someone who is interested in becoming a Catholic or you know a Catholic who has been away for some time and wants to return, this program and process is for them. Give Fr. Joe Ngo their names or have them call Fr. Joe.

At the last Parish Pastoral Council meeting we discussed the issue of the homeless that sleep on the parish property at night. For several months we did not have many problems with those who slept in the various doorways of the church, school, and rectory. The last several months we have experienced an increase of the numbers who were sleeping here and we have also experienced a certain number of problems. After prayer and deliberation we have decided not to allow people to sleep on parish property at night. One of my main concerns is the safety of parishioners and if people do not feel safe coming to church, then we have to do something about that. I feel for those who found the church property a safe place at night. But the increase of violence and drug-use no longer make this a



safe haven for anyone. We will continue to do what we can as a parish to minister to the poor and homeless.

There was too much rain this past weekend and earlier this past week, so the sealing of the patio in front of church had to be re-scheduled. We will hopefully do it beginning Monday, September 8th. Pray for a week of good weather.

We will be doing a parish census this fall by asking parishioners to fill out a census sheet. We are looking for some basic information so we can have accurate records. One of items on the census sheet will ask about "sacraments." I suspect we might have a number of adults who have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation. If that is the case, then we can address that issue by a preparation program. So a census is not just because we are nosey but so we can serve you better.

On Monday, Labor Day, there will be one Mass and that will be at 9:00am. Celebrating the Eucharist is always a good way to thank God for the many gifts we share and on this day to thank God for the work we have. "Prosper the work of our hands, O Lord. Prosper the work of our hands." And happy new school year to all those going back to school!

We want to express our appreciation to Catherine Scott for the three years of office assistance. She has been invaluable to us during the chapel fund drive and with our bookkeeping. Due to budget constraints this position has been eliminated. We want to wish her well and God's blessings for the future.

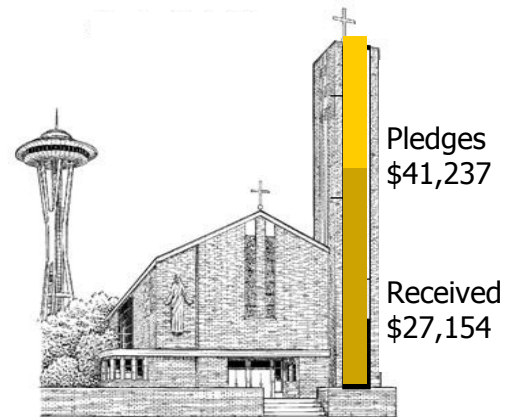

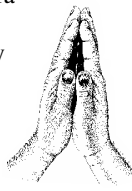

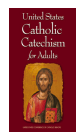
