A While with Father Grile

Dear Parishioners,

Last Monday, April 20th, the church basement at Sacred Heart became the temporary home for Noel House, an overnight shelter for women. The shelter is run by the Archdiocesan Housing Authority and Catholic Community Services. (Those are some of your Annual Catholic Appeal dollars at work.) The shelter is utilizing the space well though it is a bit cramped. The women seem pleased with the space and even the newcomers are finding out where the shelter entrance is. The other night the doorbell rang about 11:00pm and sure enough it was a late-night referral for the shelter. It's easier to walk a person to the entrance than it is to tell them where it is. Thanks to all Sacred Heart parishioners for opening your hearts and doors to our sisters in Christ. I'm sure there will be some bumps along the way but we have begun the journey.

This week we officially launch the Annual Catholic Appeal. By way of good news, last week we received a rebate check for \$598 from last year's appeal. That means we met our parish goal by over \$598. That is terrific. We'll use the extra money to help pay the extra electrical bill we incurred during the renovation of the church basement.

When I look at where the Annual Catholic Appeal dollars go, I can see evidence close to home here at Sacred Heart. We have Sacred Heart Shelter, which is also run by the Archdiocesan Housing Authority and Catholic Community Services. The shelter serves women and children in transition. They share in the Annual Catholic Appeal. Also the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning and Research Department will be tabulating and issuing a report for us on our recent Needs Analysis Survey. That department is funded by the Annual Catholic Appeal. As priests in the Archdiocese, Fr. Joe and myself benefit from the various programs for continuing education for the clergy and those programs are funded by the Annual Appeal. We as a parish have also benefitted from the wise counsel of various Archdiocesan offices such as the Office for Parish Financial Services. So your Annual Catholic Appeal dollars do good here and throughout Western Washington.

This coming Friday is First Friday and we will again have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our Adoration Chapel from 12:40pm to 8:00pm. The adoration time will end with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Take time with the Lord and you will find time for what really counts.

We'll have Adult Catholic Catechism class this Wednesday, April 29th, at 7pm in the Fellowship Hall in the church basement. All are welcome. The Scripture Study class will be taking a summer break before reconvening in the fall. Fr. Joe is also thinking about a once-a-month class on various topics. Watch the bulletin for further details.
